To address space constraints in the architecture branch library, we have weeded the collection, moved a limited number of journal back-issues off site (see questions 6 & 7 above), and laid out the collections differently within the existing branch library footprint. These steps have allowed us to maintain growth space and also improve user spaces in the branch.
