 - Opportunity to revisit Classics & related disciplines.
 - Diversifying the field.
 - Students interested in looking at the past in different ways,
- Academics & Librarians who support 'Classics': Their profiles and roles. Challenges associated with supporting expanded cultural studies programmes, e.g., outmoded disciplinary and library collecting fault lines.
- Should the SIG extend its focus to cover:
